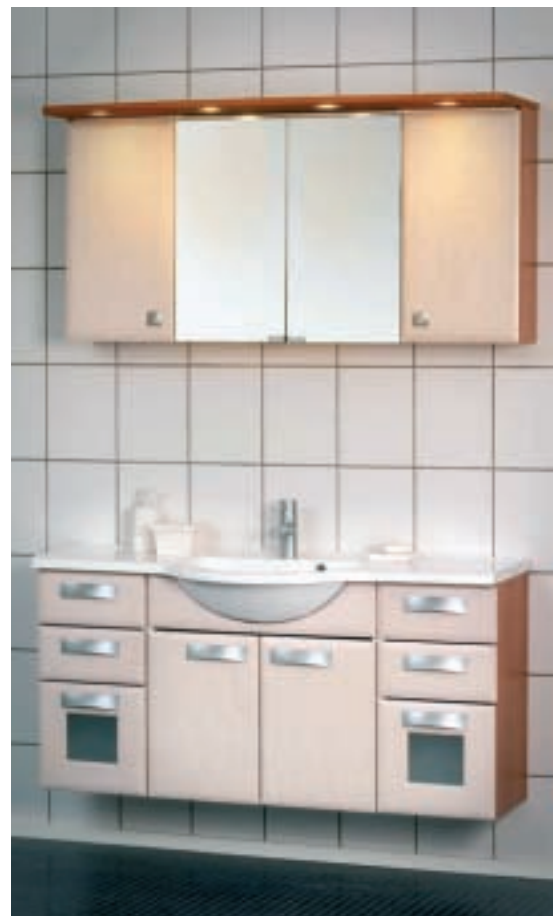

Wood species



Alder

Alder is a slightly rare wood species that is used in the kitchen. It has however become a popular wood species thanks to its exquisite natural brown colour and beautiful grained appearance. Alder is by nature more vivid than beech, for instance. Alder is a soft wood species and is often painted. Reddish stains, such as rosewood or cherry, can also add an excellent effect.



Ash

Ash is known for its viscosity and hardness. The colour variation is great in the wood. The sapwood is light and the heartwood is dark and knotty. Characteristic for ash is the strong graining, whereby it can also be treated with opaque stains and yet the grains show beautifully. Suitable staining options are white lacquering, blue, green, yellow, silver, etc. For instance, cherry can be recommended from translucent stains.



Birch

Birch is a light domestic wood species that features a glistening wood surface, where the grains can be lightly seen. There are thin brown stripes in the surface. Birch is a durable wood species, the features of which are often compared to the hardness of beech. Birch is the most popular when white lacquered or translucent stained, for instance cherry, cognac, or white glazing.



Beech

Beech is a hard and enduring wood species. The colour is light reddish brown. The wood surface is lighter and becomes darker and knottier towards the heartwood. Specific to beech are the pith rays, which are seen as small brown stripes and spots on the wood surface. Lacquering is a suitable surface treatment for beech, as there is no strong graining. If you wish to change the natural brownish tint, translucent staining, such as rosewood and cherry, is recommended.

Oak

Oak is a very hard and durable wood species, of which valuable and long-lasting products have been made for many centuries already. Oak has a fairly dark brown nuance; its colour darkens towards the heartwood. Lighter wood stands out in the sapwood. Oak can very well be stained with opaque and translucent stains. Rosewood, cognac, and cherry are suitable from the translucent stains, as well as dark stains. When white lacquering, it should be noted that micro-fissures in the wood are revealed through staining.



Pine

Pine is a domestic, comparatively soft wood species with strong graining and clearly distinguishable annual rings. The colour of pine is for instance substantially more yellowy than that of birch. The sapwood turns yellow and the heartwood turns reddish brown due to the impact of sunlight. The effect of light can notably be reduced by staining, for example. Opaque stains are not recommended for the colouring of pine. Suitable stains are for instance honey, rosewood, and acid staining.



Heat-treated birch

Heat-treated birch is a fairly new material in the manufacture of furniture and kitchen doors. In the heat-treatment process, birch is heated at high temperature, whereby the specific properties of heat-treated wood are obtained. The colour of heat-treated birch darkens through the wood and the absorption of humidity decreases. Therefore, heat-treated wood is a perfect option for areas that need to be moisture-proof, such as in kitchens and bathrooms (not continuous moisture). Lacquering or various wood oils provide the most suitable surface treatment.
